Copper deficiency – *does this affect you?*

The impact of copper deficiency is significant and appears to be increasingly widespread due to changing agronomic practices, long term fertilizer applications and soil acidification.

Independent livestock consultants, Productive Nutrition Pty Ltd, are undertaking a review to quantify the extent of the problem and its impact on producers, which will be followed by research to test the efficacy of current treatments.
